The mission of Augsburg Evangelical Lutheran Church is to glorify God by proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ through worship, witness, education, service and fellowship.

As we come off a rather spectacular Reformation celebration commemorating 500 years since Luther posted his 95 Theses on All Hallows' Eve 1517, we immediately come to one of the most poignant, and for some, difficult, feast days of the church year: All Saints Day, November 1 (moved to the following Sunday if it falls on a weekday). On Sunday, November 5, we will celebrate a festival Eucharist at our normal two services of 8:30 and 11:00 in the morning. We will sing hymns celebrating all the saints – both those among us, and those who have gone before us.

That evening, at 7:00, we will focus primarily on those loved ones who have entered the holy city in *lux perpetua*, perpetual light. We will read the names of those loved ones, remembering their impacts on our lives. We will hear words of comfort from Revelation, "... and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes," and from 1 John 3, "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are." We will hear reassuring anthems, such as "The Souls of the Righteous" ("The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and the pain of death shall not touch them.").


I encourage you to join us in the dimly lit sanctuary on All Saints Sunday, this coming Sunday, November 5 at 7 PM, to be in the presence of the saints and God. Whether you are mourning the loss of a loved one, comforting someone who is, or are there as a member of the body of Christ and disciple of Augsburg, we will worship God and give thanks "For all the saints who from their labors rest," and where "we feebly struggle, they in glory shine!"



## Council Highlights

Congregation Council met on October 12, 2017. Following are highlights from the meeting:

- Recognized Emily Norris for her leadership role in the 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston. (Emily was attending a planning meeting in Houston at the time of the Council meeting.)
- Celebrated Emily Norris as recipient of a full tuition scholarship from the ELCA Fund for Leaders for her studies in the Master of Divinity Collaborative Program at Wartburg Seminary. She was chosen based on academics and service. She is the only recipient from NC and one of only 20 in the United States.
- Property reported that new defibrillators have been purchased for the church property.
   Repair on the front steps will begin near the end of October.
- Discussed the Safe Church workshop for everyone in the congregation who works with children. The workshop will be held on Sunday, November 5 at 4:00 PM and Wednesday, November 7 at 7:00 PM. Everyone should plan to attend one.
- Approved the following motions:
  - From Worship and Music: Hold one service on Sunday morning, December 24 at 10:30 AM (Evening Services will be at 5:00 PM Children, 7:30 and 11:00PM Candlelight-Communion)
  - From Personnel: Extend the term for the position of Director of Children's Ministries to the end of 2018, rather than July 31, 2018
  - From Personnel: Create a part-time position, Pastoral Associate for Congregational Care, for 2018 which can terminate at the installation of a called associate pastor or at the discretion of Congregation Council. Approved a job description to be posted with the NC ELCA, Wake Forest Divinity School and other appropriate sites.
  - ♦ From Finance: Approve the request for distribution of \$8,107 from the Hackbarth General Fund to be distributed as specified in the fund documents.
  - From Property: Alter 23 doors on the church property with a glass inset as required by the insurance company.
- Discussed congregational life and shared prayer concerns.
