


First Annual Augsburg Epiphany Chili Cook-Off Sunday, January 7, at 5:30 p.m. in the Family Life Center

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Congregation Council met on Thursday, November 9. The Annual Congregational Meeting was held on November 19.

Following are highlights from the November 9 Council meeting:

- Pastor Wollner thanked all those who helped to make his Installation Service and Reformation Sunday so special. The Mutual Ministry Team is in place and their first task in the new year will be to organize cottage gatherings.
- The launch of Emily Norris' Facebook Bible Study was a remarkable success. Tune in on Wednesdays at noon.
- Finance reported a surplus in the financials for October. Note: please indicate on the outside of your offering envelope where you would like your contribution to be recorded, or mark this information on the check.
- Social Ministry reported that the Angel Tree will soon be up. The Overflow Shelter opens on December 1. New
 mattresses for the shelter were donated by New Philadelphia Moravian Church. The Good Neighbor Team has
 completed their official commitment time with the refugee family and it was very successful. Thanks to the
 team for all their hard work.
- Worship and Music approved several changes to the flow and practice of the worship service. Changes will be explained by Pastor Wollner in the Beacon and will begin on the first Sunday of Advent.
- The Communications Task Force has been working on internal and external communications. There will be better access to the calendar and the website will be more mobile-savvy.
- Worship and Music Ministry Team will review, at the request of several Augsburg disciples, the benefits and disadvantages of changing to one-service. Suggestions included a change temporarily, seasonally or occasionally. Worship and Music previously discussed and voted on this question and decided to keep the two services as currently practiced.
- Discussed ways to use surplus amounts, if any, at the end of 2017.
- Approved the following motions:
 - ♦ That \$85,014 be awarded from the Hine Fund for the Fall quarter and \$7,838 be awarded from the Endowment Fund
 - ♦ Adopt the job description for a part-time Youth Ministry Coordinator to be posted with the NC Synod, Wake and Duke Divinity Schools
 - ♦ That \$4300 from the Hensel Unrestricted Fund be used to finance a CBIZ appraisal
 - ♦ Allow the use of the Family Life Center for the RJ Reynolds Cross Country Team end-of-season banquet on November 20, at 6:00 PM.
- Discussed congregational life and prayer concerns.

- Approved unanimously the proposed 2018 Budget of \$824,113 with projected income of \$818,592 and deficit of \$5,521.
