The mission of Augsburg Evangelical Lutheran Church is to glorify God by proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ through worship, witness, education, service and fellowship.



On Sunday, February 18, Emily Norris - Augsburg's Director of Student and Social Ministries - will be installed as a Pastoral Intern at both services. We are delighted to welcome Deacon Tammy Jones-West, Assistant to the Bishop of the North Carolina Synod, to be part of this special day.

This role, commonly known as a Vicar, will allow Emily the hands-on experience she needs as part of her preparation to be an Ordained Minister in the ELCA. Emily is part of a unique program through Wartburg Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa, called the Collaborative Learning Program. This program is designed to allow church workers to stay in their roles while preparing for future pastoral calls.

Emily has completed two years of studies in the classroom and recently received her endorsement from the NC Synod Candidacy Committee. She is excited to begin internship. However, Emily's internship will look a little different than previous interns here at Augsburg.

The "traditional intern" model is designed to have a seminary student serve as a Vicar in a congregation full-time for one year. However, the Collaborative Learning Model is designed for students to keep their current roles while also serving as interns. This means the internship experience is longer than the traditional model.

Beginning this month, Emily will be serving the church in this dual role. That means 50% of her time will be devoted to her current roles and 50% will be in her role as Vicar. She will serve as the Vicar for 18 months instead of the traditional 11 month cycle. Emily has worked closely with Pastor Paul, the Personnel Committee, and the Council to create a healthy balance of these roles.

Vicar Emily will coordinate with Pastor Paul to be involved in the work of the church that she has not focused on in the past. This will include preaching, visitation, church administration, and many other tasks. She also will continue to serve the wider church as all Augsburg's interns have in the past.



The Internship Begins

Each week, Emily will spend about 12 hours in the Christ Beloved Community. CBC is a joint Episcopalian-Lutheran Mission Start on South Main St. which focuses on the Hispanic and African-American Communities. Emily will share her pastoral talents with this community as it grows into an established congregation. This will be a great experience for her to be a part of.

Each month, Emily will serve two Sundays in worship leadership roles at Augsburg and two Sundays at Christ Beloved.

In order to keep a healthy balance in all the ways Emily serves God through Augsburg, Emily will be supervised by Pastor Paul and have the support of an Internship Committee. She will also have a set Sabbath day each week (Fridays) to ensure her ongoing well being.

This is an exciting time for Vicar Emily and the church. Please keep her in prayer as she takes this next step on her call journey!

YOUTH MINISTRIES

Augsburg introduces new Youth Ministry Coordinator:

As Emily Norris transitions to her role as Vicar, many of the important duties that she has done in leading our youth ministry program no longer fit into her ministry schedule. Last year the Council recognized that there

are many roles related to the youth program that require more than volunteer assistance. These include weekly planning and leading of meetings, but also long range and retreat/ travel planning. That led to the creation of a part-time Youth Ministry Coordinator position and an interview process in which both internal and external candidates were interviewed.

After a thorough interview process, we are pleased to announce that Robin Welch has been hired to serve as the role of part-time Youth Ministry Coordinator. Robin brings decades of experience in youth ministry and has a passion for the young people of our congregation. Her energy and enthusiasm for youth ministry is evident in all of her interactions with our youth. Robin will begin her role on March 1.

Since the formation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) in the late eighties, Augsburg has played an important role in the life of the church beyond the congregation level. Our partnership with the North Carolina Synod, and the whole ELCA, has borne much fruit over the last three decades.

We continue to see that partnership at work in many ways today. Our support of renewing congregations, encouragement of global ministries, and helping to end hunger are just a few of the ways that we partner with the wider Church. Now, we are being invited to partner with the ELCA through their "Always Being Made New" campaign. This campaign continues to address the ways we have been supporting the wider church already, but now focuses on a priority very close to us...the growth of future leaders.

It is a unique joy for Augsburg to help support four women and men who are called to professional ministry – Athena Bless, Anna Carter, Emily Norris, and Collins Pritchett. The whole Church is in great need of new leaders, and we are honored to support them. But the Church also needs the support of congregations like Augsburg to help other students achieve their goals as well.

The final phase of the "Always Being Made New" campaign focuses on the raising up of new leaders through the Fund for Leaders in Mission Program. Our own Emily Norris is a Fund for Leaders recipient. We are called to support this effort by joining other congregations like ours as participants in this campaign.

On February 24 and 25, we will learn more about this campaign from Cheryl Philip and Sylvia Black. Cheryl is the manager for donor relations, based in Chicago, who visited with Augsburg last year, and Sylvia is a fellow disciple from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Chapel Hill who serves on the national Campaign Steering Committee. Ash Wednesday Services: As we begin this year's Lenten journey, all Augsburg disciples are invited to attend an Ash Wednesday service either at 12:00 noon or at 7:00 P.M. The Imposition of Ashes and Communion will be available at both services.



Mid-week Lenten services are nearly upon us. This year, following the Faith Journey given at each Wednesday evening service, we will use Compline (also called "Night Prayer" in *ELW*) as our service of worship. Compline is a Divine Office (like Vespers) that completes the round of daily prayers and praise. The origins date back to the 4th century monastic custom, and come out of the ancient Jewish tradition. Its name comes from the Latin *completorium*, or "ending," "to complete." The canticle *Nunc dimittis* (Now, Lord, you let your servant go in peace...) and the Latin hymn "To Thee, Creator of the day's last light" are traditionally sung at this service.

Comments:

The year to date surplus was \$38,150 before Council approved the following expenditures:

 A. The 2017 budget approved by the congregation could only satisfy \$60,000 of the requested \$87,781 NC Synod Mission support. \$5000 was sent to the NC Synod, \$3000 was sent to Lutheridge, \$3000 was sent to Lutherock, and \$3000 was sent to Christ Beloved. These additional gifts bring us closer to meeting mission support requested by the NC Synod for 2017.
 B. \$11,500 was used to support Augsburg's Youth Ministry ministry.

C. \$5768 was used to support the seminary student, and the 2017 budget could not support this ministry and funds were used from the Hackbarth Education Fund. With the 2017 surplus, the Hackbarth Education Fund was repaid so that these funds could be used for future ministries.D. \$682 was used to support the Summer Day Camp ministry, and the 2017 budget could not fully support this ministry and funds were used from the Hackbarth Education Fund. With the 2017 surplus, the Hackbarth Education Fund was repaid.

- E. \$2000 was used to replenish Music Dedicated funds that were used for guest musician expenses.
- F. \$500 was used to replenish Arts at Augsburg dedicated funds that were used for event expenses.
- 2. With these additional expenditures, the initial year to date surplus decreased from \$38,150 to \$3,713.
- 3. Disciples have also given to support the greater community through special benevolent giving.
