Every day I'm learning just how faithful God is. It is surprising and humbling and reminds me that God is always at work for good and that we are fortunate to live in the midst of God's incredible and creative story.

Over the years we have fostered a beautiful relationship with Lutheran Junior Seminary (LJS) in Morogoro, Tanzania. We have been blessed to partner with the school in a variety of ways: friendship, prayer, and project. Most recently, we raised funds to help provide a new water supply for the students and teachers at LJS. Our original goal was \$16,500 which we were able to raise a significant portion towards. This past June, when I traveled to Tanzania I was able to bring this gracious gift to our friends. Though it was not the entire amount we had originally hoped for, we were certain that it would be extremely

helpful and contribute toward their goal for a new well.

Wouldn't you know though- because God is always up to something- the amount we shared ended up being exactly enough!

During a meeting with Pastor Ndosi, Director of Lutheran Junior Seminary, he shared that when the water surveyor, a ministry in partnership with ELCA Global Mission, came to assess the land, it was determined that instead of spending the money to dig a new well that may or may not produce, they would instead expand, fix, and improve the current well and pump.

The initial improvements include:

- 1. Non-return values to make the water flow in only one direction. This will help when they join the new (deeper) source of water with the present source.
- 2. Purchase water pipes to bring water from the farm water tank to the other two tanks.
- 3. Treat the present water table and then once stable, dig deeper to establish and expand a new water table.
- 4. Purchase a new pump and holding tank.

While I am not an expert in this area, I am beyond thankful for those who have answered their call through this life-giving and life-sustaining ministry. Currently the work has begun at the seminary with hopes to be complete come mid-summer.

Thank you to all who so faithfully supported this project and for all who hold our Tanzanian sisters and brothers in their hearts and prayers. The gift of water is powerful for not only the body but also the soul.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Council President Neil Linnell called the meeting of the Congregation Council of Augsburg Lutheran Church to order on Thursday, February 11, 2018.

Pastor Wollner thanked everyone for the successful Council Retreat held in Chapel Hill February 2-3 and acknowledged that multiple ministry teams were focusing on similar initiatives in support of our goals.

Our staff and Ministry Teams would like to highlight the following efforts and activities:

- Pastor Wollner asks you to sign up for Cottage Gatherings, to pray for Emily as she begins Internship, and to encourage our Ministry teams to create initiatives to live out our goals
- Cantor Olsen would like your help in recruiting new choir members for both services. He reminds us of Wednesday evening worship through Lent featuring Faith journeys followed by the Office of Compline sung by the congregation and choir.
- Evangelism encourages you to warmly greet our newest members who were received on February 11 as well as visitors and reminds you to hold April 21 for a tour of the church and lunch.
- Property is working on snow removal procedures, review of building, maintenance and repair needs, and FLC lighting concerns.
- Social Ministry is working on "Rise Against Hunger", a project of packaging meals for the hungry. They are seeking volunteers for that project as well as for the Overflow Homeless Shelter.

Council approved the following motions:

- Goals for 2018 and Goals for 2018-23 These will be shared with disciples beginning with Pastor's Cottage Meetings in March.
- Hine Fund rewards totaling \$31,868 for the winter quarter
- A recommendation from the Personnel Ministry Team that we hire Robin Welch for the parttime position of Youth Ministry Coordinator in accordance with the job description previously approved by Council. The start date is March 1. The position will be re-evaluated in summer, 2019.
- A recommendation that we establish a flat rate of reimbursement of cell phone use up to \$80/ month for pastoral staff of the church due to reliance on mobile phones as part of their jobs and to be available for emergencies


