This is the day the Lord has made! Christ is risen, and through him all creation is made new! Indeed, "God shows no partiality" (Acts 10:34): Christ's resurrection truly brings life to everyone. We sing hymns of praise, gather around sacred words, and proclaim God's faithfulness, power, and love in the feast of holy communion. With the women at the tomb, we are astonished, elated, and grateful. We depart with joy to proclaim the good news of God's endless love.

The mission of Augsburg Evangelical Lutheran Church is to glorify God by proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ through worship, witness, education, service and fellowship.

We welcome you to the Easter Day service at Augsburg Lutheran Church. After weeks of reflection and preparation during Lent, on this morning we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Our service this day has no confessional rite since it is a continuation of the liturgy of the *Triduum*—the services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday—which has no concluding benediction.


The assembly turns to face the cross as it enters the sanctuary, following the cross as we have followed Jesus into this holy place and time of corporate worship.

FIRST READING Acts 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to [the people]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

SECOND READING Colossians 3:1-4





GOSPEL Matthew 28:1-10

The holy gospel according to Matthew. Glory to you, O Lord.

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. 





The general purpose and intent of the Hine Fund is to "put into effect a ministry of Christian mercy and concern in meeting human needs as the Church thinks Jesus Christ Himself would have them met."

Christ's Beloved Community, our ministry partner congregation in South Winston-Salem, is experiencing a dramatic increase in demand for their weekly food pantry. This past week their shelves were empty and they had to suspend service. Augsburg has already responded with financial support, but it will take time to procure all of that food from overwhelmed sources. In order to ensure that food can be distributed next Thursday, the pantry needs actual food donations this week. Any non-perishable items are accepted as long as they are in a sealed package. (Refer to the list in the Flocknote message.) In order to comply with the current "stay at home" orders, we are working to help make collection easier. On Tuesday afternoon, April 14, Augsburg members will be present at the following locations to collect food donations. At each of these locations, we ask that one person at a time approach the truck to maintain social distancing practices. Our helpers can also remove items from your trunk if you remain in your vehicles.
