
In the mercy of almighty God,




SECOND READING Romans 12:1-8

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. 

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* "Faith of Our Fathers" (ELW 812/813) is a well-known hymn that was written by a Roman Catholic for Roman Catholics in 1849, but was soon adopted by many Protestants. Today's Sending Hymn is based on this familiar hymn, but with language that expands the understanding of the Body of Christ. This more inclusive text, written by Joseph R. Alfred was first published in 1981. As you will note the new text moves "from fathers to mothers to sisters, brothers, and 'faith born of God.' " (Paul Westermeyer in Hymnal Companion to Evangelical Lutheran Worship, 2010). The author of the hymn says the following about his version [as cited in Hymnal Companion, p. 689-90]:

In writing the new verses for "Faith of our fathers," I wanted to do more than just mention women in passing. I wanted to express the unique contribution of women in many areas of the church's life, from the church kitchen to the mission field, even in times when those contributions were severely restricted. In verse 3, the setting moves from the past to the present, recognizing that even today, Christians still face persecution, imprisonment and even death for our faith. The last verse affirms the divine source of the faith that gives us strength and vision, uniting us as one Body of Christ across all times and places, all classes and genders, in the continuing "struggle of the cross until the world is made anew."
